Catherine Ging's Funeral.

AUBURN, N. Y., Dec. 8.—The funeral of Catherine Ging took place here today. Simplicity marked its every feature. The remains were taken from the undertaker's rooms to St. Mary's church at 10:30 o'clock, and the Catholic committal service was read by the pastor, Rev. William Mulheron. The usual requiem mass was not said, as today is a holy day, and funeral mass will be said Monday. The remains of the murdered girl were not exposed to public view, although there was a large crowd at the undertaker's rooms to get a glance at her face.

Miss Julia Ging, Catherine's twin sister; Mrs. Robert McGirr of New York, another sister; Miss Lulu Ireland and Officer Patrick H. Ging of Minneapolis, were the mourners. A few others, intimate friends of the family, were admitted to the undertaker's rooms. At the church the attendance was large. The remains were followed to the grave by carriages containing the relatives of the murdered girl, and the burial was in State Street cemetery within a stone's throw of where Miss Ging was born.
