Church) was organized in the late 40's by the Rev. Mr. Johnson with a few families and began worshipping in an abandoned wooden school house on Washington St. which was erected by the Village of Auburn for a separate school for colored children and later turned over by the new city authorities to the colored people for church uses. Not known if church was built on the site of the school or used as such-Storkes gives date of construction for church as 1847.TLW
