The 1850 U.S. Census has a Solomon Weaver, age 35, a peddler, residing in Clarkson, Monroe County, New York. This is another small village about 15 miles from Riga. The entries are:

Solomon Weaver, age 35, born in New York	(born about 1815)
Mrs. Weaver, age 37, born in New York	(born about 1813)
Amelia Wiley, age 25, born in New York	(born about 1825)

We find in *The Clark genealogy: some descendants of Daniel Clark, of Windsor, Connecticut, 1639-1913*, by Emma Lee Walton, 1913:

502 Mary Amelia Wylie (Mary 6, John 5, John 4, Moses 3, Daniel 2, Daniel 1), born Feb. 1822; died Mov. 4, 1855; married, 1850, Solomon Davis Weaver.

917 i Abella Amelia (Weaver), born 1850.

918 ii Edward Wylie (Weaver), born 1852; married (1) Mattie Whisler; (2) Della Craig.

919 iii Solomkon Davis (Weaver), born about 1854; died young. 920 iv Mary Ellen (Weaver), died young.

Looking at the 1850 U.S. Census I speculate that Mrs. Weaver was S.D. Weaver's mother. The age makes no sense, but both the ages of S.D. and Amelia Wiley, actually Wylie, are also incorrect. Mary Amelia Wylie and S.D. may not have been married at this time as we only know they married in 1850. As Mary Amelia Wylie appears here, Mrs. Weaver cannot be S.D. Weaver's wife, and so the speculation is that she was the mother of S.D. From the Clark Genealogy we know that S.D.'s full name was Solomon Davis Weaver, so it's likely he was a descendant of James and Anna (Davis) Weaver.

The parents of Mary Amelia Wylie were Moses Wylie, Jr., who was born Oct. 26, 1794, and died March 12, 1838. Lebanon, N. Y., and Mary Clarke, born June 17, 1792; died June 17, 1828, they married in 1817. Buried in Campbell Burying Ground.

The 1860 U.S. Census has an S.D. Weaver, age 42, a deputy sheriff residing in Detroit, Michigan. With him are:

Adeline M. Wylie, age 22, born in New York	(born about 1838)
Bella Weaver, age 10, born in New York	(born about 1850)
Edward W. Weaver, age 8, born in New York	(born about 1852)
Mary E Wylie, age 2, born in New York	(born about 1858)
Eliza Smith, age 17, a servant	
Frank J. Rush, age 18, a clerk	
George Jones, age 19, a servant	

The Wiley (Wylie) names tie the 1850 and 1860 U.S. Census households together.

Mary Amelia died 4 November 1856, and so doesn't appear in the 1860 U.S. Census. Instead there is an Adeline M. Wylie and two year old Mary E Wylie, perhaps a relative that stepped in to take care of the young Weaver children. Bella Weaver (Abella Amelia Weaver), born 1850, and Edward W. (Wylie) Weaver, born 1852 are also in the 1860 U.S. Census. Most probably the young Solomon Davis Weaver and Mary Ellen Weaver had died by 1860. There is no entry for an older Mrs. Weaver that would be S.D. Weaver's mother, she may have died between 1850 and 1860.

In the Chestnut Hill Cemetery, in Union Springs, Cayuga County, New York, are listed the following.

This is certainly Mary Amelia Weaver, the Wife of S.D. Weaver. The "Solomon Jr." and "Solomon 3d" point to S.D. Weaver's father as Solomon. The date of Solomon 3rd matches the information on the Wylie family from the Clark Genealogy book above. So,

the question is why the Utt name and how did Amelia come to be buried here? S.D. Weaver and Amelia had a daughter Mary Ellen, is this the Mary Utt listed here?
